## Welcome...

We have had a bit of disruption this week as you know due to teacher strikes. Sadly it looks like teaching unions and the Government are not reaching a resolution and there may well be further strikes in the Autumn Term. These strikes are likely to include all four teaching unions and therefore this could increase the amount of disruption to learning.

Obviously the dispute is centred around pay for teachers, and it is clear that schools face a significant challenge in recruiting and retaining teaching staff. One element of the dispute is that if a pay-rise is agreed, school's may not receive any extra funding to support these salary increases, and so they would have to be paid out of the existing school budget. This could have a very real impact on school funding.

However, I am pleased to say that AVA is fully staffed for September, unlike many schools I am aware of. We have been aware of this impending crisis and have taken proactive steps to ensure we are prepared for September.

Despite this prospect, there is still a huge amount to feel positive about. The Summer Term is often the busiest and we have seen multiple Sports Days, performances and trips taking place during the good weather. Such an important part of school life.

The weather forecast for next week looks mixed, and so we will expect students to be in full school uniform, including ties and blazers.

A reminder that we close on **Thursday 20 June** at **12.25pm**. Children entitled to Free School Meals will be able to collect a packed lunch as they leave if they wish to.



Aylesbury Vale Academy is very pleased to be partnering with Freedom Technology in order to offer parents and carers the opportunity to purchase a laptop to support their child's home learning.

At AVA all home learning is set and monitored electronically using MS Teams, meaning home access to technology is vital for success in the Secondary phase.



Laptops can be bought upfront with one payment, or the cost can be split into monthly payments. Laptop purchase comes with a full service/repair package included and if the problem cannot be fixed straightaway, a temporary laptop can be loaned out whilst yours is repaired.
