

World Maths Day

World Maths Day was celebrated on Wednesday 8 March with 60 students from both the Primary and Secondary phases participating in a global maths challenge.



This was an amazing opportunity to get both phases together to learn and enjoy a bit of Maths. The students were well behaved and felt very supported by staff.

There were over **<u>12000</u>** schools participating globally and here are the global stats:

- Year 6: 38th
- Year 7: 46th
- Year 8: 54th
 - Years 9-10: 39th

With more than **112,230** students from **2,427** schools competing across the UK alone, here are our rankings:

- Year 6: 10th
- Year 7: 9th
- Year 8: 8th
- Years 9-10: 4th

Our top students were **Abhinav D** (Year 6), **Dihein W** (Year 8), **Isabella P** (Year 9) **and Jonathan C** (KS4).

These results are a huge success for our students for putting their maths skills to the test in a Live Mathletics arena going up against hundreds of thousands of students worldwide. The wow factor should not stop here.... Teachers and form tutors please celebrate with these students whose names I will attach in a document. Gold, Silver and Bronze certificates will follow.


