


AVA'bury Festival 2023

Another PB for Ibukun F

Last weekend was another successful one for Ibukun F in Year 9. Competing at the YDL Athletics Competition in Kingston, Ibukun ran yet another PB of

11.6 seconds in the 100m, propelling him in to the Top 20 runners in the UK in his age group. Ibukun also completed his first 300m sprint in just 39.6 seconds, entering the UK Top 50 in the process.

Nicotine pouches

Nicotine pouches, also called 'modern oral nicotine products', are white pouches that contain nicotine - among other ingredients.

Despite being a nicotine product, it is not against the law for under-18s to purchase these products. However, they can lead to nicotine addiction, mood disorders and the lowering of impulse control.

Pouches are placed between the users' upper lip and gum, and are then disposed of once the flavour and nicotine has been absorbed.

These pouches are banned at AVA, and we would strongly advise that children U18 are not allowed to use them.

Exam expectations:

- Students must attend all exams that are allocated to them on their individual candidate timetable.
- Misreading the timetable will not be accepted as a satisfactory explanation for your absence.
- If a student misses an exam due to illness, you must telephone the school.



- Mobile phones, headphones, watches, bags will be left in the main hall before students enter the exam hall. The main hall will be locked for the duration of the exam. Students can then collect their belongings from the main hall once they've finished the exam.
- Device found on a student in the exam hall and turned ON: disqualification from entire subject award.
- Device found on a student in the hall exam and turned OFF: disqualification from that component.
