# **Rotary Club Technology Tournament 2023**

On Monday 6 February, AVA hosted the Rotary Club of Aylesbury's 2023 Technology Tournament.

Design, Technology and Engineering students from local schools and colleges formed 24 teams across three categories - Foundation, Intermediate and Advanced.

Teams were given their design challenge and a set amount of modelling materials in the morning. They then had around 4 hours to problem solve, design and model a working bascule bridge structure that could also carry a load.

The academy had five teams representing us and they were amazing! All teams created a portfolio of design ideas and a working structure as well as developing communication and time keeping skills.



Against some tough competition one AVA team achieved 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Intermediate category. Congratulations and well done to all students who were involved. We look forward to competing again next year.

# **HPV Immunisations**

The Buckinghamshire Immunisations Team are visiting your school on **Monday 13 March** to deliver the second dose of the HPV Immunisation to the Year 9 pupils.

Most of the students would have already consented to this vaccination last Year, although Parents can still consent to the vaccination if their child missed the first dose whilst they were in Year 8.

If you have not previously consented for your child to receive the HPV vaccine you can do so using the link and school code in the attached letter. Please note that a further consent form is not required for your child's second HPV dose.

# **Bike safety**

As a school which promotes healthy exercise and encourages students to walk and cycle, we are pleased to see the number of students who travel to and from the academy in these ways.

However, there are some concerns which we would like to make parents and carers aware of.

The first concern is the number of students who do not wear a helmet, or wear one incorrectly. In addition to this, during the winter months when it was dark at school opening and closing times, it is important to ensure bikes are fitted with lights and reflectors to ensure visibility to other road users and pedestrians.



Staff who patrol the area outside school have witnessed several near misses on the roads and paths around school, and so we ask that you discuss these safety issues with you children, and support students to remain safe while cycling to and from school.

We would also like to remind parents that it is currently **illegal** in the UK to use a privately owned electric scooter on public roads, pavements or cycle lanes. Electric scooters can only be legally used on private land with the permission of the landowner, and so children should not be riding electric scooters to school.

# Calling all medics

For students aged 14-18 considering careers in medicine, we've got a few work experience projects they can get involved with. Each one can help them decide if a career in medicine is the right choice and provide some stand out work experience for applications to med school.

<u>Medicine Work Experience Week In London</u> **February 12 - 18**. 1 week in person course including accommodation, meals and teacher supervision. Students visit different hospitals in London for work experience.

<u>Virtual Medicine Work Experience Week</u> **February 20 - 24**. 1 week online course where hundreds of students take part, gaining work experience through different activities each day, hosted by our team of practising UK NHS doctors.

Online Radiology Work Experience Saturday 4 March - Another free session we are running for all budding medics. Interactive day where students can get involved in diagnosing patients with our NHS doctors. Simply join through the link, we've 1,500 places available.

Thanks to all our lovely Year 9s who went on the Berlin trip you did me proud.


Good luck to Lewis B-W for his boxing fight on Saturday 25 February I'm sure your hard work will pay off, and we are proud of you regardless.



Mrs Leach says... We wish all the Year 11 students a safe and restful half term.

After half term students will be able to use Core PE and RS as extra revision time. This has been communicated with students.

#### Spacing and Timing of Revision

'Spacing' is a revision technique which is all about spacing revision so students don't get swamped and overwhelmed. It means introducing time intervals into their revision sessions as well as spacing out the days on which they revise for topics.

Research suggests there is an 'optimal gap' between revision sessions for students to retain information. In some studies, using spacing instead of cramming has resulted in a 10% to 30% difference in final test results.

#### What can you do?

Help your child create a revision plan which maps out what they are going to revise and when. Help them to choose a mixture of subject topics to focus on each day to make sure they are spacing them out. Encourage them to review information using different revision techniques to help them carry out some 5-10-minute reviews of topics, such as reading through notes, highlighting information or making post-it notes.

#### **Year 11 Revision Evening**

We would like to invite you and your child to our Year 11 Revision Evening at AVA on **Thursday 9 March**, from **6pm** to **7.30pm**. The aim of

the session is to give guidance to you and your child in planning their revision and using revision strategies in preparation for the summer exam period.

Research has proven that supportive parents can make a difference at this crucial time. During the evening there will also be subject specialist on hand to support with revision. discussion with Mr Gibson about how the habits of our own community can have a positive impact.




