Welcome...

I would like to thank all parents for your cooperation this week due to the industrial action. I appreciate that this caused inconvenience but, as you know, this was a dispute between teaching unions and the Government and not the school. More industrial action is planned for Wednesday 1 March and I will aim to give you as much notice as possible about whether we can open or not.

Recently we have seen a rise in students vaping inside and outside of school. This is extremely worrying as some vapes contain up to 50 times the amount of nicotine as a cigarette and sadly, it seems young people are able to get their hands on these quite easily. To



prevent this as much as possible we will have to issue severe sanctions, which may include internal isolations and suspensions. We will also conduct random searches to address this problem. I would be grateful if you could emphasise this message with your child.

To end on a more positive note I want to share with you some feedback I received from a member of the community who got in touch with me this week. She and her two friends had a gate held open for them by three AVA Year 7 students on the new Buckingham Park cycle path. The correspondent felt compelled to contact me to share this "really lovely polite behaviour", going on to say "they are a credit to the school."

This type of respectful behaviour is exactly what we will be rewarding with the launch of our **Respect** postcards this week (see below), and hopefully you can look forward to your children arriving home with these in their hands. It is so important to recognise when they do well.


<u>Place2Be</u> is a children's mental health charity with over 25 years' experience working with pupils, families and staff in UK schools.

The Empowerment Project for Young Males

Mentoring, Coaching and Positive Activities

Community Youth Ventures in partnership with the 'Saving Lives Fund' - a charitable fund held and managed by Heart of Bucks and Buckinghamshire Council' would like to offer young people in Chesham, Aylesbury, and High Wycombe the opportunity to attend the Empowerment Project, a project for young males between the ages of 11-18.



Each young person attending the programme will have access to:

- One to one mentoring and coaching
- Weekly activities involving sports, healthy living, music production, cooking, life skills and social events.
- Positive activities in the school holidays which include a summer residential and days out
- Signposting to other services
- Preventative workshops on staying safe, personal safety, managing emotions and anger, reducing negative behaviours, relationships, exploitation, and reframing the mind.

What makes The Empowerment Project unique is that we use different methods of youth work, from detached,

outreach, youth club sessions, school-based education and one to one support.

All services are free of charge.

Careers

Calling all medics

For students aged 14-18 considering careers in medicine, we've got a few work experience projects they can get involved with. Each one can help them decide if a career in medicine is the right choice and provide some stand out work experience for applications to med school.

<u>Medicine Work Experience Week In London</u> **February 12 - 18**. 1 week in person course including accommodation, meals and teacher supervision. Students visit different hospitals in London for work experience.

<u>Virtual Medicine Work Experience Week</u> **February 20 - 24**. 1 week online course where hundreds of students take part, gaining work experience through different activities each day, hosted by our team of practising UK NHS doctors.

Online Radiology Work Experience Saturday 4 March - Another free session we are running for all budding medics. Interactive day where students can get involved in diagnosing patients with our NHS doctors. Simply join through the link, we've 1,500 places available.

Mrs Leach says... A number of Year 11 students have sat an 'official' exam this week. Morale has been high and students have taken it all in their stride.

Keeping active during Revision

Research shows that physically active students have more active brains - even walking for just 20 minutes can significantly increase activity in the brain. Exercise helps to oxygenate the brain and release tension, helping students to keep calm, mentally relax and study more efficiently.

This means that it is really important for students to take regular breaks in their learning. Exercise can improve cognitive brain function, increase students' ability to focus for longer periods, reduce stress levels, and improve memory retention.

What can you do?

- Support your child to take regular breaks so they are less likely to get distracted whilst revising. It's much better to spend 60 minutes revising well and 10 minutes on a break than for your child to spend longer half revising and half playing with their phone!
- Suggest to your child that they take breaks every 60-90 minutes when revising.
- Encourage your child to do something active with their break, such as getting some fresh air, playing sport, going for a walk or a run, or doing housework. Remind them that exercise doesn't have to last for hours to count.
- Work with your child to help them work efficiently and find a routine that works for them.
