Welcome...

As you will be aware I have had to partially close the school on two occasions due to strike action. There has been a lot of speculation about whether national strike action is going to go ahead on Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March. However, we have received no confirmation and therefore need to plan as if strikes are going ahead. We do have a number of staff taking industrial action as before, and we are in the process of finalising those plans. I hope to be able to confirm those plans with you on Monday 13 March at the latest. It is likely that our decision to partially close will be similar the previous strike days this year. I am very grateful for the level of understanding by parents who have had to make alternative arrangements. Clearly you recognise that teachers are in dispute with the Government and not the school.

Regardless of this disruption, there still remains a huge amount going on at AVA. It's great to see our Duke of Edinburgh cohort expand year on year and

being able to take all of our Year 11, 12 and 13s to the Bucks Skills Show. I have never seen such a focus on careers at AVA than is taking place now, and the opportunities for students are significant. For example I am pleased to say that we have reintroduced Year 10 Work Experience after several years of pandemic-related interruptions. Many schools have decided not to offer this.
