





Mrs Leach says... Mr Gibson hosted the Year 11 assemblies this week. On Thursday he focused on exam stress and staying calm during the exam season. Research shows that having someone to talk to can help relieve this stress. Support from a parent, teacher or friend can help young people share their worries and keep things in perspective.

You can watch our for signs of stress and encourage your child to talk to a member of school staff or someone who they feel is supportive. If you feel your child isn't coping, it may also be helpful for you to talk to their teachers at school.

Encourage and support your child to build and maintain healthy habits before and during the exam period, such as eating a healthy balanced diet, staying hydrated, getting enough sleep, doing exercise, having time to relax and socialise with friends.

Remind your child that feeling nervous and anxious is normal. Support them to be organised, have a routine and build a revision timetable. Try not to add to their pressure by being flexible with them. Talk to them about how they feel, remind them of their goals in life and motivate them to stay focused. Staying calm will help them remain calm – and exams don't last forever.

Work experience opportunity:

We have 2 very unique work experience courses coming up soon, an online course that can be enjoyed at home and an in person course in London.

Our online course takes place on **Saturday 13 May** and is a day of Surgery work experience. This interactive day is delivered by practising surgeons & current medical students and is designed to give students a meaningful insight into careers in medicine and surgery. The in person course takes place at Kings in London on Sunday 21 May 2023 where students aged 14 to 18

are allowed to enter the dissection room. It is real dissection room with NHS doctors. When we ran this one in December, students from all over the UK and Europe travelled to attend. Students can find out more and register here.
