


The Revision Skills morning was a chance for our Year 11 students to be taught the skills to revise and then given time with their peers to put the skills into practise. A

**Mrs Sharma says...** The Year 12 students visited Greatmoor Energy from Waste site as part of the Inspiration Programme.

They learnt about how our household waste generates 25 megawatts of energy, which is enough to power 40,000 homes.

We followed the process around the plant, seeing the grab crane, grate

burn and turbines. While there, we gained a more detailed understanding of the importance of recycling.

Mrs Pykett and Mrs Ripley conducted a special assembly that educated our 6F students about the health issues linked to vaping. The assembly was thought provoking and insightful and led to a debate and discussion in class, which was interesting to hear different points of view.
