Suspected case of Covid-19 in school	Students, staff, visitors, contractors	Spread of disease	 Students who becomes unwell with symptoms of Covid-19 (new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or have a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they must be sent home and advised to follow 'stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection', Parent/carer advised that student should arrange to have a PCR test to see if they have coronavirus. Move the student, awaiting collection, to a room where they can be isolated behind a closed door, depending on the age and needs of the child, with appropriate adult supervision if required. Open window for ventilation. If it is not possible to isolate them, move them to an area which is at least 2 metres away from other people. If they need to go to the bathroom while waiting to be collected, they should use a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom must be cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else. PPE must be worn by staff caring for the child while they await collection if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained (such as for a very young child or a child with complex needs).
