Dear Parents/Carers,



Today is St David's day. We have watched a virtual assembly in school about our Saints Day's. In line with our British Values focus all staff attended a training session on Tuesday led by Ms Pickett who oversees this area for us.

Yesterday was 'stranger danger' day and as always, we discussed this in school with the children. We handle these topics with age-appropriate sensitivity and ensure that the children are able to discuss any worries that they may have.

Thank you to the parents who attended the council meeting for us to represent the school and discuss the issues around parking. We have had more incidents this week and the dangers continue to be a very real concern for us. We would encourage everyone to report any dangerous parking - including parking on the yellow lines - on Fix my Street.

We are in a really tricky situation as parents have asked to be reminded and updated on the status of the monies collected but we feel that we are continually asking for money which then adds pressure to families.

We don't feel that we have a happy medium at present. I am attending a Headteachers conference next week and have raised this as a discussion point to see what other schools are doing.

Reflection

During half term, whilst many of us were celebrating Valentine's Day, Christians around the world began the season of Lent, which began on 14th February also known as Ash Wednesday.

Lent lasts for 40 days. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Maundy Thursday just before the Easter weekend. However, Lent is actually 46 days, as the six Sundays are excluded.

Each Sunday during the Season of Lent many Christian churches decorate a Lenten Cross. This is a simple wooden cross decorated with a violet stole (the church colour of the season). Each week articles are placed on or by the cross, symbolising the events of Christ's last days before his crucifixion. Each item is a reminder of the events of the Easter story.



- A palm leaf is a reminder of Jesus entry into Jerusalem when the crowds cheered him as the Messiah.
- A moneybag and coins represent the thirty pieces of silver paid to Judas Iscariot for betraying Jesus.
- A water bowl and towel recall that before the Passover meal Jesus washed his disciples' feet. A humble action to demonstrate his teaching that he came to serve, not to be served.
- Bread and wine are a symbol of his actions during this last meal, when he took bread, broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying 'this is my body broken for you' and passed round a cup of wine, saying 'this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you'.
- After his arrest and condemnation Jesus was beaten, scourged and humiliated; so nails and crown of thorns remind us of these things.
- Finally on Easter Day the cross is decorated with flowers, signifying new life, and the resurrection.

As we end the week, we invite our community to join us in a prayer for Lent... God, you guide and direct us on our journey through life. Be with us as we make our Lenten journey of faith and love. Help us to grow closer to you during this special holy season. Help us to do your will each day during Lent. Renew our hearts and our lives that we may live as your people. Help us to reach out to others and to share your love with all. Amen
