Medical Update

Our primary aim at AVA is to improve the life chances of children through education.

In order to ensure safety, we have a small team of first aid trained staff who are on hand to deal with issues as they arise throughout the day, alongside treating and supporting students with known medical conditions.

Please do not send your child to school if they are experiencing symptoms that warrant a 111 call. Parents who feel this service is required should do so with the child in their care. We have seen an increase in returned 111 calls redirected to the school. These calls will no longer be accepted as they could compromise the well-being of the wider school community.
