# **New Reading Books**

Last year at the AVA, we invested a significant amount of money to re-vamp our banded reading at home books. These books are matched to our Read Write Inc Phonics programme, meaning children are bringing home high-quality books that they are able to decode and ensures that they are practising the sounds that have been taught in their daily Phonics sessions.

For our older children, the books are high quality and diverse, exploring both fiction and non-fiction. They provide suitable challenge, whilst allowing children to develop their reading fluency.

Caring for these books: Please ensure your child looks after these books. They should not tear or crease the pages, bend the spines back or deface the pages by drawing or writing on them and - most important of all - keep books away from leaking water bottles. A lot of time and money has been spent providing these top-quality books and we need your support to ensure that every child is able to benefit in the long term. Damaged books: So that we can continue to provide children with high quality reading at home books, there will now be a £3 charge for any damaged books that are returned to us. All books are checked over by the class teacher before being changed, so we can monitor this closely.

Thank you for your understanding in this matter. We want to ensure all children continue to get the best resources in order to support a key part of their education and learning.

### Medical


