# PARENT BULLETIN 7 11th October 2024

Dear Parents/Carers,

There are lots of national events happening at the moment and in school we have mainly focused on two this week. We have paid particular attention to World Mental Health Day yesterday with all the activities and assembly focusing on this. We undertook work around positive interactions, looking after each other, being kind and prioritising well-being. We are also in our second week of Black History Month. This is a topic that we study across the school (with Year 5 having this as a term long topic). These subjects hold a special place in our hearts, and we ensure that they are covered, with the time and dignity they deserve.

The children that represented the school not only played superbly but showed great sportsmanship towards each other and the opposition. We have many fixtures booked in many different sports over the course of the year and hope lots of children will enjoy these, get involved and represent the school.

This week we had our two last open events of the year.

Both were well attended and as always it was an absolute pleasure to be able to show our school off to the wider community, who may not have visited before. As always, our children were impeccable with our visitors seeing a range of activities from different lessons to playtime with some even seeing assessments! It is always so heart-warming when visitors who do not know us comment on our warm, friendly and positive attitudes and environment.

With the weather being so up and down, we need to be prepared for every eventuality. Please do not assume that when you send your children to school in the morning it is going to be a fine day. The weather seems to change by the minute.
