Respect is one of our three core values and it is a value that we talk about and show every day. To show our support for Anti-Bullying Week, children are welcome to wear odd socks this week.


Our PSHE lessons this week will have an anti-bullying focus and there will be a special assembly to explore anti-bullying as well.

Loving God,


We pray that we can walk in your light and create our own light for others to see and feel.
