

Please can we remind parents that any non-essential appointments must be made outside of school hours. As a school, we authorise absence for illness, medical appointments that cannot be scheduled outside of the school day, religious observances and exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the Headteacher. We are also as accommodating as we can be when unavoidable emergencies happen. It is vital that your child is in school as much as possible in order to maximise learning. When children are taken out part way through the day, it disrupts their day, as well as the lesson they are in. Please ensure all non-essential appointments are made outside of school hours.

Our wonderful choir went to sing at Roman Park today. It always brings so much joy and happiness to the people involved in these events and the children sang beautifully. Our children made Christmas cards for all of the community that we sang for, and they were really pleased to receive them.

The seasonal sickness is doing the rounds for staff as well as children. Please can we remind all parents that if your child has been sick/vomiting or has diarrhoea please **do not** send them into school.

Sickness and diarrhoea spreads quickly with children and adults. It is imperative that they are kept at home for 48hrs from the last bout of illness. If they are sick or have diarrhoea again then the 48hrs starts again.

This spread of illness impacts staff as well, this includes coughs and colds, we have had extremely high levels of staff sickness alongside the children and ultimately it is the rest of the children who are impacted in their learning.

We must also remember that in school we have immune compromised staff and children who can become seriously ill. We must all be responsible for minimising the risk and stopping the spread of infection.

#### THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT
