Dear Parents/Carers

It has been a brilliant start to term and the new school year.

It's been lovely to welcome so many happy, smiling children back to school. This, of course, includes our new children in Reception. Applications open for secondary places in October, this includes spaces in AVA secondary.

We are excited that our Year 6 children will either attend a weeks' residential or a themed week in school from 13th September. This has not been possible due to COVID 19 restrictions in the last 2 academic years. We are hopeful that booking early has ensured that this event can happen!

All of our children look super smart in their uniform, please remember to send your child into school in school PE kit on their PE days. Parents will be contacted if children are missing uniform or PE kit. We have kept all lost property safe over the summer and will be putting this out the front of the school (weather permitting) on Monday for parents to re-claim. Please have a good look and remember to label/name all belongings.

Hot meals are currently £2.30 each. There will be an increase to £2.35 later in the term. We have tried to keep the cost as reasonable as possible for this fresh food. We are happy with the menus but welcome your feedback. Please let us know if you have any ideas or comments.

Meals must be booked using the School Gateway app, the kitchen only prepares food for confirmed orders. We are striving to avoid wasted food and all meals are freshly prepared. If you haven't ordered a meal it is the parent's responsibility to provide a healthy packed lunch.
