Parking


Reflection


Today both Primary and Secondary phases joined together to mark Remembrance Day. We invite you to join with us in a Reflection for Remembrance Day...

On the night of 14th November 1940, the city of Coventry endured a relentless bombing campaign. Overnight, bombs destroyed much of central Coventry, hundreds of its people and left its Cathedral in ruins. Only the outer shell of the walls and the tower remained standing.

Shortly after this event, the words 'Father Forgive' were inscribed on the wall of the ruined cathedral, and a commitment was made not to seek revenge, but to strive for forgiveness and reconciliation with those responsible. From this moment onwards Coventry Cathedral became one of the world's oldest religious-based centres for reconciliation. Today the medieval ruins continue to remind us of our human capacity both to destroy and to reach out to our enemies in friendship and reconciliation.

The words 'Father Forgive' are used as the response in the 'Coventry Litany of Reconciliation', written by Canon Joseph Poole in 1958, which is prayed in the new





The hatred which divides nation from nation, race from race, class from class, *Father, forgive.*

The covetous desires of people and nations to possess what is not their own, *Father, forgive*.

The greed which exploits the work of human hands and lays waste the earth, *Father, forgive.*

Our envy of the welfare and happiness of others,

Father, forgive.

Our indifference to the plight of the imprisoned, the homeless, the refugee,



Father, forgive.

The lust which dishonours the bodies of men, women and children,

Father, forgive.

The pride which leads us to trust in ourselves and not in God,

Father, forgive.

Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.
