Dear Parents/Carers

As the week has been so cold, we have been trying to keep warm inside by doing lots of physical activities and physical learning. Thank you for taking care around the site, especially on Wednesday when the whole area turned into an ice rink!

This week we welcomed Revd Polly Falconer and Emma from the Oxford Diocese into school to work with our children ahead of Race Equality week. Some of our children were interviewed for a training video which will be used in all of the Diocese schools across the region. It will highlight the importance of how we treat each other and celebrating differences. We are so proud of these children and know that they are great ambassadors for us all.





Polly told us a brilliant story about Black Inventors which we will continue to use and teach from in school with every year group. The children all participated and were able to ask questions and talk about the learning points.

We are really delighted to have been chosen to lead the way for Race Equality and hope that our work makes a huge difference.

Our staff from EYFS launched the next stage of our ECO school's initiative this week and we have appointed our new ECO warriors. This created a huge buzz around the school with children looking at how we can be kinder to our planet. Watch this space for new ideas!

On Wednesday Anne Andrews the RE advisor from the Oxford Dioceses joined us in both the Primary and Secondary phases to look at our RE lessons, curriculum and assemblies.
