World Maths Day was celebrated on Wednesday March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023 with 60 students from both the Primary and Secondary phases participating in a global maths challenge. There were over **12000** schools participating globally and here are the global results:

- Year 6: we ranked 38th
- Year 7: we ranked 46<sup>th</sup>
- Year 8: we ranked 54th
- Years 9-10: we ranked 39<sup>th</sup>

With more than **112,230** students from **2,427** schools competing across the UK alone, here are our rankings:

- Year 6: we ranked 10<sup>th</sup>
- Year 7: we ranked 9<sup>th</sup>
- Year 8: we ranked 8th
- Years 9-10: we ranked 4<sup>th</sup>

There should be a special mention for Abhinav (in Year 6) who came top in the Year 6 rankings!! Well done to all of our amazing Mathematicians and teachers who supported in this day.
