Dear Parents/Carers

I can honestly say I think it's taken 3 days for my shoes to be fully dry this week and then the rain came down yesterday like never before and they were soaked again! It's been cold and wet and on Tuesday I was convinced I saw snow! Please remember to send your children in with warm coats, hats, gloves and wellies when needed.

We now have our grand total for all monies collected for Children in Need, drum roll... we raised £1,365. Thank you all so much. This amount will make a huge difference to so many children.

Tomorrow (Saturday) we have a Book Sale to raise money for our Primary book corners. The last time we did this it was a huge success.

We will be based in the Secondary Atrium - please enter through the Secondary main reception. We will be there from 10am until 2pm and payments must be made via card payment. This is a great opportunity to grab some Christmas present bargains and have a cup of tea in the process.

Following on from our last hugely successful uniform sale, Mrs Allen has kindly agreed to do another sale next week. This will be before and after school on Fri 2nd Dec. She will set up near the front of the school and will be under cover if the weather continues to be wet.

On Monday we have a meeting for all of the parents in Year 6 whose children are attending the residential. This will be run by Mrs Stewart and will be at 5pm.

Every week we face issues with parking in school. We heard the sad and worrying news that a child was hit by a car on the estate and frighteningly it came as no surprise that this happened. This could easily be any of our children outside of school. I pulled a child out of the way of a driver who had no idea she was there last week- that was one of 'our' children. To update everyone, and be transparent, on what we are doing at school to address the parking issues I would like to draw your attention to the following.

We put cones out the front on the yellow zig zags this week - parents continued to park there and just blocked the road more.

I asked parents sat in their cars to think of the safety of children and move their vehicles- I got verbally abused.

I raised the concerns with our Governors, they have been in school this week observing the horrendous parking, they witnessed parents making dangerous turns and performing manoeuvres on the crossings. They were shocked by the attitude of parents towards our children and other parents.

After raising this with you all I have had no choice but to contact the police - who have given me some ideas to trial - one being speaking to the drivers!

I have been asked if I can identify the vehicles which we are able to do via our CCTV.

Before I need to take any further action I am reaching out to you all to please help us keep our children safe. There is an accident waiting to happen unless everyone starts taking responsibility.
