We understand that some families do not feel comfortable attending these events so close to Christmas, we will be recording the performances where possible. Please respect our children, staff and each other when in the building. It's really important that we continue to look after each other - especially at this special time of year.

Due to space we will not be able to have prams/buggies/car seats in the performance spaces (they will need to be left outside). If you choose to bring a smaller sibling with you, please sit with them on your lap and be mindful that many of the children performing have not done so before so may be nervous and quiet.

#### **HOPE - A refection for the 1st Sunday of Advent - Sunday 28th November.**

The season of Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas and lasts for 4 weeks. It is a time of preparation for Christmas and Advent symbols help us on this journey. The most recognisable of these symbols is the Advent wreath. Its circular shape represents God's never-ending presence. The evergreen leaves, which do not fade in colour, signify God's eternal nature. The four candles around the wreath are lit as we progress through the weeks of Advent and the central white candle is lit on Christmas day.
