The School Parliament

At the moment, times are really hard for many of our AVA families. Therefore, the School Parliament would like to appeal for a monthly collection of various household necessities which will be passed on to our local food bank where it can be accessed by those in the community who really need them.

For January we would like to collect tinned foodstuffs e.g., baked beans, spaghetti, peaches. The collection will change for each month. Any donations can be brought into the school by pupils who can then pass them onto to their teachers.

Assessments

Year 6 will use the same format as they previously have, to ensure that they are used to the routine needed for SATs.

Parent Survey

Recently we conducted our parental survey to establish what we are doing well and what we can do differently. Thank you to everyone who completed this for us. We had 260 Primary responses - which is awesome. Staff are working their way through the comments and have contacted many parents - where this was requested. I would like to share the following headlines with you:

- 98% of those who responded feel that their child is happy in school.
- 99% of those who responded feel that their child is safe at school.
- 95% of those who responded feel that their child does well at school.
- 82% of those who responded feel that their child knows the importance of prayer and reflection.
