Links in Learning

In Year 2 children studied The Great Fire of London.

In Year 4 children study the text A Midsummer Night's Dream and as part of their Design and Technology work they build bridges to see what makes a stable design. In Year 6 children as part of their History learning children will look at a significant time in British History.

History

Pupils will be taught about;

Tudor England (change in monarchs / crime and punishment – social history))

The changing power in Monarchs.

Crime and punishment from the Anglo-Saxons to the present or leisure and entertainment in the 20th Century.

Languages Spanish

Pupils will be taught to;

Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through the use of a dictionary.

Science

Properties and change of materials (Scientific enquiry – linked with DT).

Children will be taught to:

Demonstrate that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes.

Explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible, including changes associated with burning and the action of acid on bicarbonate of soda.

Music

Pupils will be taught to improvise and compose raps using the inter-related dimensions of music – based on Shakespearean sonnets.

Computing

Pupils will be taught to understand computer networks including the internet; how they can provide multiple services, such as the world wide web; and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration. Use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.
