Maths Number - Place value

Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations.

Find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number; recognise the place value of each digit in a three digit number (hundreds, tens, ones). Number – addition and subtraction.

Add and subtract numbers mentally, including: a threedigit number and ones; a three-digit number and tens; a three digit number and hundreds.

Add and subtract numbers with up to three digits, using formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction.

Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in context



Links in Learning

The History work this term builds on the work from Year 1 and 2 where they studied important historical figures. In Year 4 children will go on to look at habitats and food chains and digestion and teeth as well as planning, resourcing, building, testing and evaluating their own shield.

Computing

Pupils will be taught to;

Use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.

History

Through the Window Picturebook children will be studying; Local history, historical figure and historic houses.
