A Reflection for Palm Sunday...

This weekend Christian Churches around the world will celebrate Palm Sunday.

Palm Sunday is the day in the Christian calendar that remembers Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem for the last week of his life and the final seven days of his ministry on earth.

On his entry into Jerusalem crowds cheered and waved palm branches to welcome Jesus as 'the Messiah' (which in Abrahamic religions means 'a saviour' or 'liberator').



People wanted Jesus to bring political, social, and military liberation from the Romans. Instead of a saviour from sin and evil, the crowds expected a warrior king to save them. Their lack of understanding made them fickle and easily influenced and when Jesus didn't meet their expectations he was rejected and sent to death on the cross.
