# Ingredients for KS3 Food Technology and KS4 Hospitality and Catering

To help with rising costs of ingredients, we have made some adaptions to our recipes. You will notice that some ingredients are listed as 'optional'. This means that if you have them at home already then students should bring them to school as normal, but we will have them available to use if not. These ingredients are normally store cupboard or needed in small amounts such as oil, herbs and spices.
