
Maths Superstars




Maths Club - starting next week in D-01-01 with MBI, every Tuesday lunchtime. All students are invited.

Squid Games Parental Guidance

Over the last few days in school, we have noticed that a number of children have been discussing a new TV show on Netflix, "Squid Games". Some children have also been playing some of the games from the programme.

After doing some research into the programme we do not deem the content to be appropriate for Secondary aged children. The BBFC have awarded Squid Game a 15 rating in the UK for "sexual violence references, injury detail, crude humour, sex, suicide, sexual images, violence". Some are even saying that it is not suitable for anyone under the age of 17.



With this is mind please can we ask for your support in not allowing your children to have access to watching this programme or discussing details of the content. We take the safety and welfare of your children seriously this includes any online content and appreciate all of your support in this matter.



Black History Month

Celebrations continue as we reflect on the ways Black people have contributed to society.





While Black History Month is synonymous with prominent figures such as Martin Luther King Jr. Harriet Tubman and Rosa Parks, there are countless other Black people who've made a profound impact in history - whether it be politics, culture, or the economy - around the world. Black history is world history.

Each week, this month, we will take a closer look at some of these figures to show that the story of Black people has always had global impact.

Ignatius Sancho

Ignatius Sancho was a very important individual in the anti-slavery movement. Although he died in 1780, just as the abolition campaign was gaining momentum, abolitionists hold him up as proof that Africans were intelligent and cultured. He proved that 'An untutored African may possess abilities equal to a European'.

Sancho's life was one of amazing determination. He was born in 1729 on a slave ship crossing the Atlantic but orphaned in the same year. His mother died shortly after his birth and his father killed himself rather than accept the shame of existing as someone else's property. Sancho's owner brought him to England where he met the Duke and Duchess of Montagu. They supported and encouraged him in his ambition to become the first African writer to be published in England. He became part of the arts scene in London, and earned a reputation as a composer, writer and businessman.



Inter-House PE Competitions

Students next week will have the opportunity to take part in their first inter-house PE competition. They will be able to compete in their houses to score points which will go towards their house total, and will also be added to sports day towards the end of the year. Last years winners were Franklin.

This first half term's competition will be Football and Netball and will run during those specific after-school clubs next week giving students in year 7-10 the chance to take part.

We look forward to seeing some healthy competition between students in their houses.

Additional Exams

Any students wishing to sit an additional GCSE exam in their Home/First Language where offered and who can speak, read, listen, and write in that language to a standard equivalent to GCSE French or Spanish examinations, can be entered and sit this in May/June 2022. Usually this is a fantastic opportunity to achieve a top or high GCSE grade with very little time commitment. While we cannot offer tuition in school, students can get help finding practice papers and get advice on exam preparation, especially the speaking test.

Students should contact Mrs Leach as soon as possible to, ideally during next week, so that initial entries can be made before half-term (22/10).

Personal Development
