## **Black History Month Art Competition**

Black History Month was first launched in London on the 1980s where the aim was for the local community to challenge racism and educate themselves and others about the British history that was not taught in schools. Throughout history, black people have always been part of the fabric of the UK, but there has been a lack of representation in the history books.

# Special Educational Needs, Free School Meals and the Pupil Premium

If you have concerns regarding your child's learning and would like to discuss them with the Special Educational Needs team, please complete the online form, <u>here</u>.

#### Free School Meals and the Pupil Premium:

Some children are entitled to Free School Meals, which in turn allows them to access the 'Pupil Premium'. Children are entitled to Free School Meals if their parents/carers are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit except if you meet ANY of the following criteria:
  - entitled to working tax credit (regardless of income)
  - have an annual income in excess of £16,190 (Please note that this figure is for April 2018 and that it changes in April each year).
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

## **Year 7, 9 and 12 School Photographs**

#### **Microsoft Teams and EduLink**

All students have now been provided with login details for Microsoft 365, which is what they need to use to access for various tasks and lessons throughout the school day. It is also the method by which they will access their home learning, through the MS Teams Assignments application.

To ensure students can access Microsoft 365 at home, they must first login on a computer in school and reset their password to something they can remember. This will then allow them to login on devices outside of school. All Year 7 students especially, need to make sure they have logged on to a PC in school first and changed their password accordingly: there is time to do this within the school day.

Parents and carers do not have direct access to Teams, but they can use EduLink to view home learning information for their child. Login details for EduLink have recently been emailed out to any parents/carers who have not previously used EduLink.
