This week was marked with the various remembrance events. The joint School Parliament from primary and Secondary, laid two wreaths donated by the Parish Council at the statue of the unknown soldier at the front of the school, while some of our students read Binyon's Ode on Remembrance.

Students also attended assemblies on the Armistice and Remembrance throughout the week which provided and insight into the sacrifices made by those who fall in war.

The whole Academy came to a halt at 11:00am on 11th November for a two minute's silence after the Last Post had been played. It was pleasing to see students join staff in the Atrium for this wearing the uniform of their various organisations: Army Cadet Force, Sea Cadets, Air Cadets and Scouts. There was a real moment of tranquillity and reflection. It epitomised Binyon's Ode on Remembrance:

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn; At the going down of the sun, and in the morning, We will remember them

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
