A Career in Medicine?

Before Christmas Mrs Leach, Achievement Director for Year 11 shared an opportunity with all students to experience a nine week Medicine and Dentistry course with Kings College London. Three of our Year 11 students signed up and are now balancing their GCSE studies along with this course. They have 9 lectures throughout the course as well as mini projects. They are Akindu K, Fizah Q and Filip K

Fizah gave her review of the course so far:

The KCL Outreach Medicine and Dentistry Programme interested us as it seemed like a good opportunity to gain more of an insight into both fields. Firstly, it helps with references for Sixth Forms, College and Universities as we get certificates at the end of the 9-lecture course at the end of the summer. Some of the recent lectures spoke about the day-to-day life of both a surgeon and a dentist. This helped us to understand how the regular routine looked like for someone in that position and how we can manage our time when we get into that career. Furthermore, it allows young aspiring medical and dentistry students to

understand the qualifications that are needed to get there. Additionally, it gives young people the opportunity to learn about specific professions within both fields, understanding what part they are most interested in and how they differ from others. Finally, it helps to think about the practical sides of specific occupation rather than just focusing on the academic perspective of the jobs.
