# Helping your child get in to good habits


# Did you know?



Research reveals that there is a strong link between healthy habits and pupil achievement. Poor health habits add up to poor grades, and research suggests that healthy habits and good health-related decisions can lead to improved academic performance. For instance, research has shown that students who eat breakfast exhibit improved concentration when compared to their peers who skip it.

Healthy habits are essential to living a long and happy life, and they are important to instil in children from a young age. If you help them form these habits now, you will be giving them the tools to navigate any obstacles they may face as they grow into adulthood.

Research highlights that the late teenage years have been identified as the peak age for exposure to health risks with lifelong implications. The report, by the Association for Young People's Health (AYPH), revealed teenagers eat eight times the recommended sugar allowance and almost half have tooth decay. This worrying research also found out that most smokers start by the age of 25.



# What can you do?

Cultivate healthy habits by being a role model to your child. Try to exhibit good habits, offer health advice and build fun healthy activities into your family life. Examples include being active as a family, having evening and sleep routines, providing a water bottle to encourage hydration, or making family meals together.

Good nutrition can help improve concentration, so pay attention to the food you buy for your family. Provide a healthy balanced diet of meals which include fresh vegetables, fruit, proteins, good fats and whole grains.

Encourage your child to snack on low sugar foods and drinks, which you could make together.

Help and encourage your child to get enough sleep, live a physically active life and feel good about themselves. Work with them to map out their week to include healthy habits such as exercise, relaxation and seeing



friends. Set some healthy lifestyle goals together, and keep each other motivated to stay on track.

#### **EduLink One – Online Parent Portal**

EduLink One gives parents and carers quick and easy access to information such as your child's timetable, achievement points, behaviour incidents and attendance information. As the year progresses we will also be able to share information such as attitude to learning grades, assessment data and student report profiles.



If your child is new to AVA, you will soon receive an email from <a href="mailto:avacoms@theacademy.me">avacoms@theacademy.me</a> inviting you to log in. To do this you will first need the School's ID Code: AVA.

Parents and carers of existing AVA children have already been sent joining instructions. If you are experiencing any issues accessing your account, you may need to use the School's ID code AVA, or to reset your account password/username via the 'reset login' option on the login page once you have entered the ID code.

One new feature for 2022 is the Homework area, where you will be able to access details of assignments and home learning set by class teachers on Microsoft Teams, including both deadlines set and whether the work has been submitted on time. We will be asking students to manage this aspect of their home learning record as the year progresses.

The best way to ensure you all have up-to-date knowledge of what is available is to download the EduLink One App to your mobile or tablet and set up push notifications within it. This facility will give you 24-hour access to all updates to your child's/children's records.
