
Lockers:

This week we are dedicating the Year 10 Parent Bulletin piece to the role of a Prefect. Earlier in the week we announced to the students that the application process to become a Prefect is now open with the closing date being Friday 27th May, 3pm.

What is a Prefect?

A Prefect is a student who takes up a position of leadership in the school community. A student who is committed to making a difference in the school. Someone who demonstrates our school values of *Respect – Aspiration – Resilience*.

Why would a student become a Prefect?

Being a Prefect at AVA means gives you a chance to develop your leadership skills.

It is also a valuable way to express pupil voice. It gives you a chance to give your view within the school community.

You can include your Prefect position on your applications for Sixth Form and University.

The Prefect team will be structured in 3 tiers:

Head Prefect Team Deputy Prefect Team Prefects

What might some of the jobs that a Prefect will do?

Represent the school at events such as:

- Open evening
- Award evening
- Parents evening
- School Productions
- School Inspections
- Assemblies
- School tours
- Prom organisations
- Leavers assembly organisation
- Public Speaking

How to apply for the Prefect role?

1. Complete the application form, including Predicted Grades.









- 2. Ask the Tutor to complete the reference part. They will need to include:
 - Achievement Points/Behaviour Points and Attendance.
- 3. Student to write a covering letter address to Mrs Lutchi & Mrs Leach stating why they would like to become a Prefect.
- 4. If they wish to be part of the Head or Deputy Head Prefect team, then they need to express this in their application.

Deadline Friday 27th May, 3pm.
