We are in ever changing times. On Wednesday evening, the government confirmed that they do not advise face masks in classrooms from Thursday 20th and no face masks in communal areas from Thursday 27th.

On Monday 17th, we had 62 students who had tested positive and were self-isolating. On Thursday 20th, this had dropped to 56. Mondays are always better for introducing changes to routines in schools and so we will review our position on Monday and hopefully we can ease our face mask controls gradually.






Year 11
