Common Skills Issues in Bucks:

Skills mismatch: Between skills sought by employers and those held by residents.

Attracting talent: Challenges due to high housing costs. lack of vibrancy in urban centres, poor public transport to rural areas.

Retaining talent: High proportion of skilled residents leave for university or move out for better jobs.


Small businesses: 42% of employees work for companies with fewer than 50 people (32% nationally).

Recruitment difficulties: 18% of employers had hard-to-fill vacancies (15% nationally).

Skills shortage vacancies: over a third of vacancies are due to skills shortages.

Staff proficiency: 13% of employers had staff not fully proficient (national average 15%).

Training issues: 30% of employers with a skills gap cited lack of appropriate training; 58% funded or arranged training (national average of 60%).











FILM & TV

- UK Film and TV sector is booming.
- There are nearly twice as many creative industry jobs per head in Bucks than the national average.
- Pinewood Studios, the home of the British film industry; the James Bond and Star Wars franchises; and Disney's UK base, is located within Buckinghamshire.
- The National Film and Television School in Beaconsfield is one of the top film schools in the world.
- Other local companies include CTV Outside Broadcasts and Naked West: think Strictly Blackpool and royal weddings; The Apprentice and Grand Designs.

















FILM & TV

Pinewood Studios:

- For over 85 years, Pinewood Studios have been making films, enabling storytellers to bring their creations to life on big & small screens. (Taskmaster, Ru Paul's Drag Race)
- Home to classics including James Bond, Star Wars and the Marvel Cinematic Universe. (23 of the 25 007 films)
- Pinewood Studios in south Bucks is home to the legendary 007 Stage, 23 stages, 3 dedicated state of the art TV studios, the unique permanently-filled Underwater Stage, acres of backlot production space plus post-production and lighting services.
- It has plans approved to grow further over the next few years and will create thousands of new jobs.










- Space is one of the UK's fastest growing sectors.
- Westcott Space Cluster, near Aylesbury, is home to a growing number of space related-companies, developing new technologies include rocket propulsion, 5G comms & autonomous ('smart') systems like drones.
- Big developments are planned on the Westcott site over next 10 years. a £5.9m boost in Nov 23, and likely to create 2,300 highly skilled jobs in manufacturing and over 1,000 on-site technical apprenticeships.
- There are currently skills shortages for technicians and propulsion test specialists within the space sector. Studying STEM subjects at school is the best starting point for a career in the space sector.














Engineering: Nammo, Westcott

- Nammo Westcott supplies chemical propulsion to spacecraft manufacturers.
- Rocket engines and thrusters are bought by commercial, defence and science markets.
- In 2016 it was a Nammo Westcott engine that provided the insertion burn to allow NASA's JUNO spacecraft to successfully enter into orbit around Jupiter.
- Their Westcott employees work on development, production and testing.

Good provision for clinical roles, the sector needs to attract more people into the 50% of jobs in non-clinical roles.

- English, Psychology, Sociology, Biology, Chemistry, Health and Social Care
- PE useful for work in physical rehabilitation

- Why important?
 Restaurants need more chefs –
 some may close without them.
- Facts:
 - Over 400 new jobs since 2019
 - 837 job ads in 2024
- Why it matters: Good hospitality attracts visitors and workers.

Large Goods Vehicle (LGV) Drivers

- Why important?
 Deliveries depend on drivers –
 many are retiring.
- Facts:
 - 515 job ads in 2024
 - 2,280 employed in 2024
- Why it matters: Needed for moving products, both between businesses and to customers.

Gardeners & Landscape Gardeners

- Why important?
 Hard to find trained gardeners.
- Facts:
 - +428 new jobs since 2019
 - 314 job ads in 2024
- Why it matters: supports with visitor and leisure attractions
