You can opt to do a full-time study in one subject area, 3 A level equivalent, vocational qualification in any one of the following:

BTEC National Level 3 Extended Diploma in Business

 BTEC National Level 3 Extended Diploma in Creative Digital Media Production

Or you can opt to do a range of subjects combining BTECs and A levels.

Minimum requirements:

We ideally require a minimum of a grade 4 in 5 GCSE / vocational subjects including Maths and English for admission into our Sixth Form for all our vocational qualifications.

For A level Psychology we require a minimum grade of 6 in Maths and English.

We provide an excellent support programme for resits in English and Maths for students who do not achieve a level 4 at the end of year 11. We are proud to share that our year 13s achieved a 100% pass rate in both subjects in 2022.

Beyond the Classroom



All Sixth Form students are also strongly encouraged to get involved in a variety of activities beyond the classroom that enhance their personal development in new and exciting ways. For example, our weekly Inspiration Programme in Year 12 prepares our students work life after school by providing hands-on practical experiences with real world organisations. Throughout the year, students learn about work, life, arts and culture, police and criminal justice, community and environment as well as personal health and wellbeing. They acquire specific skills for CV writing and the career options available to them.

We provide relevant work experience opportunities through our excellent links with employers to develop employability skills and extend their learning beyond the taught curriculum.

In addition, we take pride in our ongoing success with the Young Enterprise initiative. Our students have consistently received awards and recognition in a wide range of categories locally and nationally. For example, in 2021, the YE team were awarded a business contract from a local housing developer for their recycled home product. Furthermore, the team were awarded the second place for The Company of the Year Award at county level.

Building on their cultural capital, all subject areas organise visits from relevant industry experts for seminars, educational trips and workshops to deepen the students awareness of the working world. For example, the Health and Social Care students regularly visit local care homes to develop their understanding of how person-centred care is delivered.

Furthermore, our Student Leadership programme encourages the 6th formers to take on leadership roles that involve adopting a charity, leading teams, organising fundraising and raising awareness in the community. Students are encouraged to join the Student Parliament, become a mentor to younger students, provide in-class support and become ambassadors at events run by the Academy. All of these opportunities allow our students to develop the outstanding interpersonal and leadership skills needed to successfully tackle the demands of further education and employment.
