Minimum requirements:

We ideally require a minimum of a grade 4 in 5 GCSE / vocational subjects including Maths and English for admission into our Sixth Form for all our vocational qualifications.

For A level courses; Maths, English Literature and Psychology we require a minimum grade of 6 in Maths and English.

We provide an excellent support programme for resits in English and Maths for students who do not achieve a level 4 at the end of year 11. We are proud to share that our year 13s achieved a 100% pass rate in both subjects in 2021.

To support students in recognising, developing and demonstrating the key values of the academy, we present RAR Awards at the end of each term at the Sixth Form. Students can achieve these awards in a range of areas.

The awards recognise several aspects: attendance, punctuality and professional dress, performance at the work experience placement; two activities from a wide list of community service activities such as being a mentoring buddy, leading a charity event or taking on a student leadership role. These awards help to inform UCAS applications, job references, personal statements etc.

Beyond the Classroom

All Sixth Form students are also strongly encouraged to get involved in a variety of activities beyond the classroom that enhance their personal development in new and exciting ways. For example, our weekly Inspiration Programme in Year 12 prepares our students work life after school by providing hands-on practical experiences with real world organisations. Throughout the year, students learn about work, life, arts and culture, police and criminal justice, community and environment as well as personal health and wellbeing. They acquire specific skills for CV writing and the career options available to them. We provide relevant work experience opportunities through our excellent links with employers to extend their learning beyond the taught curriculum.

In addition, we take pride in our ongoing success with the Young Enterprise initiative. Our students have consistently received awards and recognition in a wide range of categories locally and nationally.

For example, last year the YE team were awarded a business contract from a local housing developer for their recycled home product. Furthermore, the team were awarded the second place for The Company of the Year Award at county level.

Building on their cultural capital, all subject areas organise relevant educational trips and workshops to extend the students awareness and learning. For example, the Health and Social Care students visited a local care home to develop an understanding of how person-centred care is delivered. Furthermore, students are encouraged to join the Student Parliament, become a mentor to younger students and become ambassadors at events run by the Academy.

All of these opportunities allow our students to develop the outstanding communication and leadership skills needed to successfully tackle the demands of further education and employment.
